

EUROPAKONZERT 2023 FROM BARCELONA

In the richly detailed architecture of the Sagrada Família, Kirill Petrenko conducts the Europakonzert of the Berliner Philharmoniker 2023. The fact that he "always finds his approach to Mozart," as he himself says, "through opera" is immediately apparent: In Mozart's Symphony No. 25, the motet Exsultate, jubilate and the Coronation Mass, he explores dramatic contrasts with the orchestra, a renowned quartet of soloists and the Barcelona-based choir Orfeó Català.

WALDBÜHNE 2023: GERMAN OPERA NIGHT

Radiant heroes, eerie forests: The Berliner Philharmoniker and conductor Andris Nelsons end the season at the Waldbühne with romantic opera. They are joined by star tenor Klaus Florian Vogt, who is a regular guest at the world's great stages - from the Bayreuth Festival to the New York Met. This guest performance marks his debut with the Berliner Philharmoniker, including his signature role as Wagner's Lohengrin. Alongside the fairytale world of Weber's Freischütz, we hear music by sound magician Richard Strauss: his Till Eulenspiegel, selected orchestral songs and excerpts from the turbulent Rosenkavalier.

YANNICK NÉZET-SÉGUIN INTERPRETS JOHANNES BRAHMS

"Johannes Brahms and women" sounds like a bad soap opera. But the bristly Brahms, who apologized for "not having offended anyone today," cherished deep friendships with women. Reason enough for Yannick Nézet-Séguin to add this aspect to his summer festival in Baden-Baden dedicated to the composer. Together with the Chamber Orchestra of Europe, they present all of Johannes Brahms' four symphonies (individually available). In collaboration with Beatrice Rana, Nézet-Séguin also performs works by Brahms' contemporaries, such as his presumed lover Clara Schumann and his patron - and husband of Clara - Robert Schumann. Works by Ravel and Schubert round off a unique cycle.

CZECH PHILHARMONIC: SEASON OPENING CONCERT 2022

The Czech Philharmonic opens the 2022/2023 Season with Georgianborn German violinist, Lisa Batiashvili for a performance of Beethoven's Violin Concerto in D major, Op. 61, one of the earliest and most frequently performed violin concerti on such a grand scale. It was Beethoven's only concerto for violin, and it is considered to be his most lyrical work, which we will experience on stage of the Rudolfinum in the Dvořák Hall in Prague. Taking place every year on 17 November – both the day the then Czechoslovak riot police brutally suppressed a peaceful student demonstration in Prague and International Students' Day – the initiative also pays tribute to the Czech Philharmonic's support of the general strike of 1989. The first concert of the season features three works, each expressing in its own way the search for peace and reconciliation. The 2022-23 season opens with a programme that, like the rest of the season, has everything: Beethoven's Ninth, a masterpiece of classical symphonic writing; Sibelius' late-romantic Violin Concerto, the peak of soloistic virtuosity; and the Israel Philharmonic premiere of a work by Arvo Pärt, one of the most revered contemporary composers. FAREWELL CONCERT OF CHRISTIAN ZACHARIAS AT THE MUSEUM OF GIANADDA

Christian Zacharias is set to bid farewell to his piano, marking the occasion with a remarkable solo recital at the Pierre Gianadda Foundation in Martigny. Zacharias's repertoire for the evening features Franz Schubert's enchanting Sonata in G Major D. 894, followed by Tchaikovsky's The Seasons. When asked about his choice, Zacharias shared, "Schubert was a natural choice for me. Not only is he one of my favourite composers, but he is also one of the few who have been steadfast companions throughout my career as a pianist." 
ORCHESTRE DE PARIS: LAHAV SHANI **CONDUCTS BEETHOVEN AND TCHAIKOVSKY -**WITH KIRILL GERSTEIN

Piano virtuoso Kirill Gerstein returns to the Philharmonie de Paris for an exceptional concert alongside the Orchestre de Paris and the dynamic Lahav Shani! Gerstein takes the sparkling solo role in Beethoven's first mature concerto for the piano, known due to its later publication date as the Piano Concerto No. 2 - a piece that shows both the indebtedness of the young Beethoven to Mozart and the singularly dramatic ardor that would continue to underpin Beethoven's later work. Shani then leads the world-class ensemble in Tchaikovsky's Fifth Symphony.



THE JOY OF SINGING

There is a special magic in singing together - everyone who has ever sung in a choir agrees on that. When a wide variety of voices come together in all their diversity, an enormous musical power emerges. "The joy of singing" follows this magic and accompanies three choir directors as they turn a group of singing enthusiasts, some of whom could not be more different, into choirs of rousing musical intensity. It is a glimpse into a field of work in which closeness and distance, identification and projection have to be brought into balance anew each time. Sometimes playful, sometimes serious, but always highly fascinated and open-hearted, the documentary illuminates choral singing as a unique symbiotic connection between all participants. The two filmmakers Torsten Striegnitz and Simone Dobmeier have succeeded in creating a great symbiosis of music and documentary film with "The joy of singing", which gives a true-to-life impression of the sense of community that singing in a choir means. Their film finds the humanity in art and the magic in music. A moving and stirring cinematic experience of great warmth that emphasizes the unstoppable power of community in times of isolation and makes understandable how music brings people together.

TEATRO AMAZONAS - THE ART OF **SOUND AND NATURE**

In the middle of the largest contiguos rainforest area in the world stands an opera house: the Teatro Amazonas. The neo-classical building in the centre of the Amazon metropolis Manaus has room for more than 700 people and was the second largest opera house after La Scala in Milan when it it was inaugurated in 1896. It was intended to delight the rubber barons in the newly emerging cosmopolitan city, the "Paris of the Tropics", with music. To make the plan of an opulent opera house in the middle of the rainforest come true, it probably took a visionary obsession similar to that of Fitzcarraldo, the eccentric entrepreneur and opera lover in Werner Herzog's film of the same name. Even today, the building bears witness to the cultural demonstration of power by a Western industrialist class that quickly became rich from rubber. They owed their prosperity to the industrial nations' hunger for the valuable raw material - and did not shy away from unscrupulous exploitation of the land and the indigenous population.

After the decline of the rubber industry shortly afterwards, the music in the house also falls silent. The memory fades, the house sinks into a thorny sleep. But the myth of the Amazon lives on...

PLEASE CALL ME CLAUDIO

UPCOMING IN JANUARY 2024

"I am Claudio - for all" quickly became a much-quoted quote from the maestro. Claudio Abbado empathised with his musicians. What particularly distinguished Claudio Abbado was his unpretentious, noble character, his democratic understanding of music-making and his gift for celebrating the live moment as such, without talking up the aura of a work in rehearsals.

The documentary (on the occasion of the 10th anniversary of Claudio Abbado's death) takes a retrospective look at his life, his performances and recordings, gets close to him as a person; and shows what of Abbado still resonates today, even into the younger generation of musicians.

Musicians such as Emmanuel Pahud and Albrecht Mayer, Abbado's daughter Alessandra Abbado and critic Kai Luehrs-Kaiser recount their memories of the decisive moment when Claudio Abbado took the stage at the Berlin Philharmonie on 27 January 2001 to conduct the "Missa da Requiem" on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the death of Giuseppe Verdi, Abbado stood at the conductor's podium, emaciated to the bone, and the audience fell into a shocked silence.

The documentary follows the work of this great maestro from his work with young musicians, his musical reality, his collaboration with the great orchestras Berliner Philharmoniker and Lucerne Festival Orchestra to his social commitment and the Orchestra Mozart.

The Orchestra for the Earth wants to draw attention to the theme of Climate Change with their music.

UKRAINIAN RHAPSODY

Ukrainian Rhapsody is a journey through Ukraine's musical history, and through a country under attack. This documentary is about Ukrainian composers and Ukrainian classical music, a musical treasure, which for historical reasons is unfamiliar to even the most seasoned of classical music collectors. After the Russian annexation of Crimea in 2014, Swedish-Ukrainian pianist Natalya Pasichnyk engaged Swedish musician colleagues in a project on Ukrainian chamber music. We meet composer profiles and musicians in Kyiv, Lviv, and Stockholm. Unique archive material from Ukraine's violent 20th century is interspersed with the story of a repressed musical heritage that stubbornly lives on. FEELING PIAZZOLLA

Feeling Piazolla is a documentary film that analyzes the melancholy in Astor Piazzolla's music (1921-1992), the best known Argentine composer in the world. The film approaches his personality, tying certain episodes in his life with his work. It's based in four stages of his life, with powerful testimonies of people who were in his most intimate circle, who contribute to answer the enigma presented by his son Daniel: "it was beyond comprehension how that music came from him, considering the personality he had...".

The documentary revolves around the artist's relationship with his work, and particularly with the feelings it evokes; avoiding being a biographical piece, but a study based on this original perspective that contributes to understand how and why his music depicts Buenos Aires's melancholy so thoroughly. With years of documentary and journalistic research, Feeling Piazzolla presents barely known material, and submerges the viewer in values, stories and metaphors, that along his beautiful music, offers an approach to Astor, not through a mere biographical experience, but through the deepness of his work, capable of moving the whole world.

The most original and also wittiest piano concerto by Rachmaninoff is the Rhapsody on a popular Paganini melody. Here, the work is performed by the cult ensemble with Daniil Trifonov on the piano and Yannick Nézet-Séguin conducting in Baden-Baden. By the way, even the genre name "Rhapsody" had to remind every American listener of Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue*, composed ten years earlier - a work that the Russian composer greatly admired. Perhaps for this reason, the tonal languages of the late Rachmaninoff and Gershwin come surprisingly close in some works.
