No fewer than 111 musicians conjure up magic that carries the singers and propels them forward: in our concert, legendary Wagner voices Nina Stemme in the title role and Michaela Schuster as Clytemnestra, who offer up plenty of mother-daughter psychodrama. The tempestuous duo is joined and brought down to earth by Elza van den Heever as Elektra's sister who yearns for love.

Bedrich Smetana (2 March 1824 – 12 May 1884) is regarded as the founder of Czech music. His father, a brewer to Count Waldstein, whose Renaissance castle situated close to the Festival Hall, had a natural gift for music and played in a string quartet and introduced the music to his talented son, Bedrich who soon played both violin and piano. His skills as a pianist were in great demand at the towns many soirées, and he enjoyed a hectic social life as a young man. He started early composing his own music both for piano, string quartet, orchestra, and later in life, opera. Internationally he is best known for his opera The Bartered Bride and for the symphonic cycle *Ma vlast* (My Homeland), which portrays the history legends and landscape of the composer's native Bohemia.

The most original and also wittiest piano concerto by Rachmaninoff is the *Rhapsody on a popular Paganini melody*. Here, the work is performed by the Rachmaninoff cult ensemble with Daniil Trifonov on the piano and Yannick Nézet-Séguin conducting in Baden-Baden. By the way, even the genre name "Rhapsody" had to remind every American listener of Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue*, composed ten years earlier - a work that the Russian composer greatly admired. Perhaps for this reason, the tonal languages of the late Rachmaninoff and Gershwin come surprisingly close in some works.



LE PIANO SYMPHONIQUE: ARGERICH. PLETNEY, LEVANON, SANDERLING

In this Best Of Concert, Argerich starts with the performance of Bach's Partita No.2 in C minor. The curtain then rises on virtuoso Mikhail Pletnev performing Schubert's Piano Sonata No. 4 in A Minor, an early composition with rich harmonies and emotional contrasts. Next up are Chopin's 24 Preludes—a romantic tour de force that marks a whirlwind start to this prestigious festival. The 19 year-old Yoav Levanon takes the stage to perform Liszt's Piano Concerto No. 1 alongside the Lucerne Symphony Orchestra, under the baton of maestro Michael Sanderling. A single chromatic theme dominates the composition and was supposedly sung to the words "Das versteht ihr alle nicht, haha!" ("You do not understand any of this, haha!") by the composer's son-in-law Hans von Bülow, one of the earliest interpreters of the concerto. Yoav Levanon continues his exploration of the works of Franz Liszt in the devilish *Totentanz*. Based on the Gregorian plainchant melody Dies irae, the Totentanz translates as a "dance of death" and reflects the composer's dark fascination with the macabre.

Recorded on the 17th and 18th of January 2024, celebrated Elisabeth Leonskaja performs Schumann's Symphonic Etudes, Op. 13, a beautiful collection of contrasting masterpieces that commence with a sepulchral march and evolve into a bright triumphant melody. She also plays Schubert's Allegro in A Minor, written in the final year of the composer's life and recognizable by its thunderous opening chords, perfectly illustrating its title "Storms of Life" — is performed to perfection by the exceptional David Fray. On the programme is also Grieg's Piano Concerto in A Minor, Op. 51, the only concertante work by the composer. An instant critical success, Grieg's masterpiece was composed in Denmark but is filled with Norwegian melodies and a sense of melancholy for his native land.

RENAUD CAPUCON AND DAVID FRAY **PLAY SCHUBERT**

An undisputed master of the lied, Schubert was also highly prolific in the chamber repertoire. Although an accomplished violinist, Schubert composed only a few pieces for violin and piano. The sonatines are early works. Nine years later, he composed the brilliant rondo and the Fantasy the following year. These are works imbued with Mozart's luminous aura. Finally, the sonata known as the *Grand duo* is a later work of larger proportions and more personal writing. Sometimes performed in a four-hand piano version, we will have the privilege of hearing it in its 'original' version by two artists at the peak of their art and their musical complicity.

Eugène Ysaÿe (1858-1931) was not only one of the greatest violinists of his time, he was also a composer, conductor and teacher. What's more, great composers inspired him. And in turn, his exceptional artistry inspired them to create exceptional compositions dedicated to him in these three concerts in Paris and Prague. The composers inspired by Ysaÿe are César, Chausson and Schumann, performed here by Boris Borgolotto on violin, Théo Fouchenneret on piano, and the Quatuor Arod.

To the delight of the audience, this occasion brings together the Twentieth Piano Concerto and the Requiem, two major works by Mozart united by their key (D minor), the tragic key by essence, that of Don Giovanni, and by their impact on our culture. Mozart's Requiem Mass is a work with a mythical aura, composed in 1791 a few months before his death, and which has become the funeral music par excellence.

This exceptional work is performed by a no less exceptional cast, including one of the greatest living conductors, Christoph Eschenbach, four incredible vocal soloists, Ildebrando d'Arcangelo. 
FESTSPIELHAUS BADEN-BADEN: STRAUSS: DIE FRAU OHNE SCHATTEN






GAUTHIER DANCE: THE SEVEN SINS


METTE INGVARTSEN: SKATEPARK

On this journey, theatre provides a fluid framework for an encounter between a group of skaters and dancers across generations. Their repeated efforts at balancing and jumping, their boisterous interaction and clashes in shared space, form something more – an entire society we can learn from.

LIVING BACH

Living Bach is a unique quest for J.S. Bach's universal secret. A journey across six continents to amateur musicians and singers, who have placed Bach at their "heart of matters". All of them are planning to attend the world's largest gathering of the Bach family that has ever taken place: The Bach Festival "We Are Family" in Leipzig in 2022. Before that Living Bach takes the opposite route... We travel to Japan, Malaysia, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Paraguay, USA, France, the Netherlands. The focus of *Living Bach* is not on JSB himself, but on contemporary people, whose lives are inseparably interwoven with the composer's music. Every continent and place visited features a protagonist and their exciting, touching, virtuoso or simply unusual connection to Bach. People to whom Bach's music has brought joy, comfort, hope, understanding changing their lives forever. Regardless of their culture, origins and financial circumstances, they are all united by an almost identical set of values: Empathy, spirituality and the search for knowledge. The Homo Bachiensis?! We enter the homes and souls of our protagonists.

We have been back just in time for the grand finale in Leipzig in June 2022, awaiting more than 3000 musicians from all over the world. Leipzig is where all our protagonists unite – if they all make it!

PLEASE CALL ME CLAUDIO...

"I am Claudio - for all" quickly became a much-quoted quote from the maestro. Claudio Abbado empathised with his musicians. What particularly distinguished Claudio Abbado was his unpretentious. noble character, his democratic understanding of music-making and his gift for celebrating the live moment as such, without talking up the aura of a work in rehearsals. The documentary (on the occasion of the 10th anniversary of Claudio Abbado's death) takes a retrospective look at his life, his performances and recordings, gets close to him as a person; and shows what of Abbado still resonates today, even into the younger generation of musicians. Musicians such as Emmanuel Pahud and Albrecht Mayer, Abbado's daughter Alessandra Abbado and critic Kai Luehrs-Kaiser recount their memories of the decisive moment when Claudio Abbado took the stage at the Berlin Philharmonie on 27 January 2001 to conduct the "Missa da Requiem" on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the death of Giuseppe Verdi, Abbado stood at the conductor's podium, emaciated to the bone, and the audience fell into a shocked silence. The documentary follows the work of this great maestro from his work with young musicians, his musical reality, his collaboration with the great orchestras Berliner Philharmoniker and Lucerne Festival Orchestra to his social commitment and the Orchestra

THE KAISER OF ATLANTIS

A documentary film by Sebastián Alfie about the genesis of the opera Der Kaiser von Atlantis by Viktor Ullmann and the life of the composer himself. Ullmann composed and rehearsed the opera in one of the most unthinkable locations: The Terezin concentration camp in what is now the Czech Republic, where Ullmann himself was a prisoner. He never witnessed the premiere of the piece, as he was deported to Auschwitz two weeks after the first dress rehearsal - together with the librettist of the work, Peter Kein - and murdered there. Thanks to a miraculous chain of events, the original score was saved from destruction and premiered in Amsterdam in December 1975.

The documentary tells a story about the reinvention of an opera with the help of the then famous medium Rosemary Brown, who was often consulted by musicians such as Leonard Bernstein and Colin Davis. The film also follows the rehearsals for the opera as they were staged in Madrid under the direction of Gustavo Tambascio until the premiere.

Who was this son of a provincial house painter whose workers' and children's songs are still commonplace today? The film is shot in original locations in Fyn and Copenhagen. Carl Nielsen, played by an actor and his voice from off-screen, is used as a leitmotif of the film

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KLAUS MÄKELÄ – TOWARDS THE FLAME

Meet conductor and cellist Klaus Mäkelä through the eyes of Bruno Monsaingeon. The legendary director discovered the young maestro's genius for the first time in 2021 at a concert by the Orchestre de Paris, when Mäkelä was just 25 years old. A wave of emotion swept through the hall, setting off a chain reaction. The orchestra expressed its desire to play again under his baton, and Bruno Monsaingeon decided to share the story of this prodigy with the world.

From his way of interpreting music to his meticulous approach to concerts (with Amsterdam's Royal Concertgebouw orchestra or Orchestre de Paris) and recordings (with Oslo-filharmonien), via his personal history and his years of training (in the class of Jorma Panula), nothing is left aside in this portrait. Through his travelling and musical collaborations, the director reveals himself as a conductor who is to leave his mark on the 21st century, although his career is just beginning. More than a simple subject of study, Mäkelä plays an active role in this documentary, lending himself to interviews, giving us an invaluable insight into his vision of music.

HOW TO MAKE YOUR DREAMS COME TRUE - THE CURIOUS STORY OF MIHO HAZAMA

How can a young Japanese woman carry on the legacy of the old jazz legends? The young Miho Hazama is a big name on the international jazz scene. In the US, she has been recognised as one of the 25 shooting stars who will shape the future of jazz. Now she is the chief conductor of the DR Big Band, carrying the torch from the jazz legends who have held the position before her. She will both carry on the legacy and take the orchestra somewhere new. Miho is from Japan and comes from a classical music tradition. She has also spent 10 years in New York with the jazz that Thad Jones, among others, helped shape and bring to Denmark in the 70s. This makes Miho a very special chief conductor - and now she is the one writing the next chapter in the history of the DR Big Band.









JACQUES LOUSSIER - WHEN CLASSIC MEETS JAZZ

The film shows Jacques Loussier's significance to the Jazz scene of the 20th century music. It includes recently filmed interviews with young pianists like Olivia Trummer, Frank Dupree, Edouard Ferlet and Jean-François Zygel, each demonstrating their personal approach combining classical music and jazz but also archival footage with Jacques Loussier and interviews with Loussier's friends and colleagues in their private environment (his widow Elizabeth Loussier, bassist Benoit Dunoyer de Segonzac, bassist Vincent Charbonnier, drummer André Arpino).



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WOMEN OF RESILIENCE - TALES OF KURDISH IDENTITY

Two former female Kurdish guerrilla fighters reconnect over their shared history and their decision to leave the movement to fight for Kurdish freedom in a different, non-violent way. A story of resistance against the suppression of one's own voice and culture. It is also a story of an irreversible, personal decision to give up everything, and of the courage of women who, like thousands of other young women, went "to the mountains"... only to leave it all behind again years later to exchange weapons for art and activism. Our powerful protagonists also tell the story of Kurdistan, a nation without a place in this world.





MARISS JANSONS: A TALE OF FOUR ORCHESTRAS

Mariss Jansons: A Tale of Four Orchestras tells the Latvian maestro's story through the eyes of the four leading orchestras which he led, either as Music Director or Chief Conductor: the Oslo Philharmonic Orchestra, the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra, the Concertgebouworkest and the Bavarian Radio Symphony Orchestra. Paying tribute to the legacy of a conductor that marked each of them, the orchestras contribute specially filmed performances. In addition to archival material featuring performances by and interviews with Jansons, new interviews with the orchestra musicians and others provide insight into why Jansons was so profoundly appreciated both on and off the conducting podium.

Loved by showbiz greats, Rachmaninoff's melodies have been repeatedly turned into songs and hits by Frank Sinatra and Eric Carmen. Even in Hollywood movies, his name is synonymous with the grand gestures of romance, while he himself was an extremely private and nostalgic person who spent years in his home in his Lucerne villa. "Breaking Rachmaninoff" aims to be the most humorous and at the same time, the most personal and moving documentary about the great Sergei.

THE JOY OF SINGING

There is a special magic in singing together - everyone who has ever sung in a choir agrees on that. When a wide variety of voices come together in all their diversity, an enormous musical power emerges. "The joy of singing" follows this magic and accompanies three choir directors as they turn a group of singing enthusiasts, some of whom could not be more different, into choirs of rousing musical intensity. It is a glimpse into a field of work in which closeness and distance, identification and projection have to be brought into balance anew each time. Sometimes playful, sometimes serious, but always highly fascinated and open-hearted, the documentary illuminates choral singing as a unique symbiotic connection between all participants. The overwhelming feeling of being part of a whole determines the rhythm of the film. Humanity is discovered in music, where the shared experience of sound becomes a social adventure and a moment of self-realization in equal measure.

The two filmmakers Torsten Striegnitz and Simone Dobmeier have succeeded in creating a great symbiosis of music and documentary film with "The joy of singing", which gives a true-to-life impression of the sense of community that singing in a choir means. Their film finds the humanity in art and the magic in music. A moving and stirring cinematic experience of great warmth that emphasizes the unstoppable power of community in times of isolation and makes understandable how music brings people together.





CHOPIN. I AM NOT AFRAID OF DARKNESS

Chopin. I am not afraid of Darkness is an unusual documentary film asking whether classical music can heal places affected by war and suffering, taking the viewer on a cinematic journey through unique and sinister sceneries. It weaves the stories of three outstanding pianists, a Pole - Leszek Możdżer, a Korean Won Jae - Yeon, and a Syrian immigrant, half a Pole - Fares, who prepare for special concerts where no one would expect to hear live music: at the former German Nazi Concentration Camp Auschwitz-Birkenau, on the border with dictatorial North Korea, and in the city center of Beirut, right after the explosion in the port there. These places need music and its power to restore dreams and trigger emotions. Will the sound of Chopin help them heal?




ALL MIGHTY MAMA DJOMBO




ENRICO CARUSO - THE ETERNAL VOICE




Paul Dessau has been all together – a violinist, conductor, composer and music teacher. As a Jew, he emigrated to Hollywood during

FEELING PIAZZOLLA

Feeling Piazolla is a documentary film that analyzes the melancholy in Astor Piazzolla's music (1921-1992), the best known Argentine composer in the world. The film approaches his personality, tying certain episodes in his life with his work. It's based in four stages of his life, with powerful testimonies of people who were in his most intimate circle, who contribute to answer the enigma presented by his son Daniel: "it was beyond comprehension how that music came from him, considering the personality he had...".

The documentary revolves around the artist's relationship with his work, and particularly with the feelings it evokes; avoiding being a biographical piece, but a study based on this original perspective that contributes to understand how and why his music depicts Buenos Aires's melancholy so thoroughly. With years of documentary and journalistic research, Feeling Piazzolla presents barely known material, and submerges the viewer in values, stories and metaphors, that along his beautiful music, offers an approach to Astor, not through a mere biographical experience, but through the deepness of his work, capable of moving the whole world.
